For Tour Groups, Automobile Clubs, Military Reunions or RV Clubs, DeKalb County is the tour destination for you. Located in northern Indiana just off Interstate I-69, DeKalb County offers your group exhilarating museums, 500 hotel rooms, conference and meeting facilities, and a county fairground.

DeKalb County has seven museums: The Auburn Cord Duesenberg Automobile Museum, showing classic, vintage and antique automobiles in the Auburn Automobile Company's original 1930's art deco factory showroom; the National Automotive and Truck Museum, displaying post WWII automobiles and trucks; the Hoosier Air Museum, featuring vintage aircraft; the World War II Museum, devoted to military vehicles and uniforms; the Kruse Automotive and Carriage Museum, displaying classic cars, racecars, carriages and coaches; the Garrett Historical Railroad Museum housing local heritage and railroad memorabilia and the DeKalb County History Museum, focusing on pre-historic artifacts, urban and rural home life.

Your group can experience shopping in historic downtown Auburn, browsing through antique shops, specialty and gift shops. Auburn, being the county seat, boasts a beautiful Ionic Greek architecturally designed Courthouse built in 1911 that is admirable on the outside, and breathtaking beautiful on the inside. You may start with the Courthouse and take a walking tour viewing the exterior architectural features and history of 44 prominent homes from the "Golden Age" of transportation. A taste of rural DeKalb County brings you to tour Sechler's Pickles in nearby St. Joe, visiting a family tradition of pickle processing that began in 1921 and DeKalb County's only remaining covered bridge, built in Spencerville in 1873.
